WORLD ELDER ABUSE AWARENESS DAY 2023



World Elder Abuse Awareness Day is observed every year on June 15. On this day the world voices its opposition to the suffering meted out to some of our older generation.

A one-day workshop was organized on the "Role of Police in combating Elder Abuse, with special emphasis on Cyber Safety of the Elderly", jointly by the Elders Helpline 1090 and Elderline (National Helpline for Senior Citizens) - both projects of Nightingales Medical Trust, along with the Bangalore City Police.
